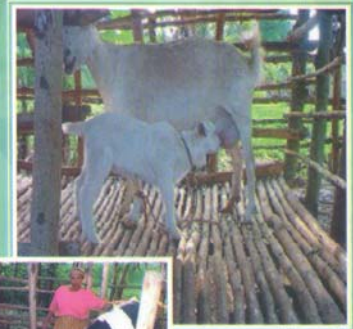
Achievements of Africa 2000 Network-Uganda

A2N-Uganda has achieved many success stories in the fight against poverty in the districts it has worked. Since 1990 A2N-Uganda has:

- Supported over 100,000 farmers in improved food security and income generation.
- Phased out projects in 9 districts (Arua, Bundibugyo, Gulu, Kabarole, Kasese, Kitgum, Masaka, Mpigi, Rakai), which are continuing on their own
- Set up 6 field offices in 6 districts in Kabale, Kisoro, Iganga, Kamuli, Hoima and Tororo
- Trained over 120 farmer trainers to promote farmer to farmer extension
- Promoted over 15 novel technologies and innovations in for example energy saving stoves, soil and water conservation, soil fertility management.
- Partnership with Government to implement various projects
- Timely distribution of Africa 2000 Network-Uganda publications which has greatly assisted in reaching out to more farmers
- Has established and assisted 50 groups / associations together with farmers.
- Has a well established Resource Center at Head office with over 1000 publications, 30 videotapes and 12 audio cassettes .

Interventions by Africa 2000 Network-Uganda

Africa 2000 Network-Uganda's interventions are aimed at enabling communities undertake investments in technologies and enterprises that facilitate better livelihood using sustainable practices. These activities include:

1. Increasing awareness about sustainable agriculture, nutrition and farming as a business.
2. Increasing agriculture and productivity through sustainable agriculture technologies.
3. Nutrition improvement at level through provision of heifer dairy goats and improved local chicken to meet the protein requirements
4. Selection and setting up model houses using participatory criteria
5. Procurement and distribution of critical inputs
6. Linkages & networking to ensure sustainability of the investments interventions.

With the above interventions, Africa 2000 Network-Uganda has been able to support over 100,000 households grow out of peasantry farming into sustainable farming by empowering smallholder farmers so that their farms are ecologically viable and economically rewarding as exemplified by Mrs. Beatrice Tirwomwe, a farmer in Kabale and other farmers in Hoima, Kamuli and Tororo districts.

Its against this background that Africa 2000 Network-Uganda wishes to introduce 'adopt a Family' initiative for your generous support which could help the organisation run more projects and hence make a difference.

Adopt a family

This initiative is geared towards promoting livelihood improvement through interventions aimed at self-reliance in terms of food security and income generation. Through this initiative, the project aims at increasing the purchasing power of the beneficiary communities, for the basic life needs and other requisites for self-actualisation.

Livelihood challenges at household level

Rural communities are highly poverty stricken and this leads to low levels of micro-economic indicators for the country e.g.

- Low yields at household level
- Low-income level
- High incidences of malnutrition
- Poor housing and sanitation
- Low productivity
- High incidences of HIV/AIDS, etc

Why adopt a family

Adopt a family initiative will enable Africa 2000 Network-Uganda and partners provide 100 families with an opportunity to own a heifer or dairy goat including basic training on management of livestock to improve their livelihoods for a better life. This will result in;

- Introduction of livestock in a household to boost their nutritional status
- Sale of milk for income generation
- Manure and fuel for energy saving stoves
